HUMANITARIAN AND MILITARY ASSISTANCE (2022-2023).

- armored vehicles (1.9% of resources).

• Military aid: Poland has provided equipment worth €2.4 billion, including 300 tanks (29.2% of Poland's resources in this category), 54 howitzers (28.7% of resources), 40 infantry fighting vehicles (2.5% of resources) and 40

• Total military and humanitarian assistance: By January 2023, it amounted to 3.56 billion euros (about 17 billion zlotys) from Poland's central budget, the Ukraine Aid Fund, local governments, and military resources.

• Contribution to GDP: This total amount is a significant part of Poland's GDP, placing Poland at the top of European countries in terms of percentage of aid to GDP.

HUMANITARIAN AID (2022)

- Aid amount: Poland's humanitarian aid to Ukraine in 2022 reached €8.36 billion (about 1.5% of Poland's GDP), putting Poland at the top of European donor countries for Ukraine.
- Distribution of spending: Aid included €6.2 billion for housing and direct financial assistance, €1.5 billion for education, and €664 million for health care.
- **Refugees in Poland:** By the end of November 2022, Poland was home to more than 1.52 million refugees from Ukraine, the highest number among European countries.



FINANCIAL AND SOCIAL SUPPORT

- Ukraine.

• Support for refugees: 828 million zloty has been prepared for 2023 for medical treatment and other benefits for Ukrainians.

• Aid collected by foundations: Caritas Poland has raised PLN 597 million to help
